Its duties: **defend the faith, serve the Church, help their neighbors.**

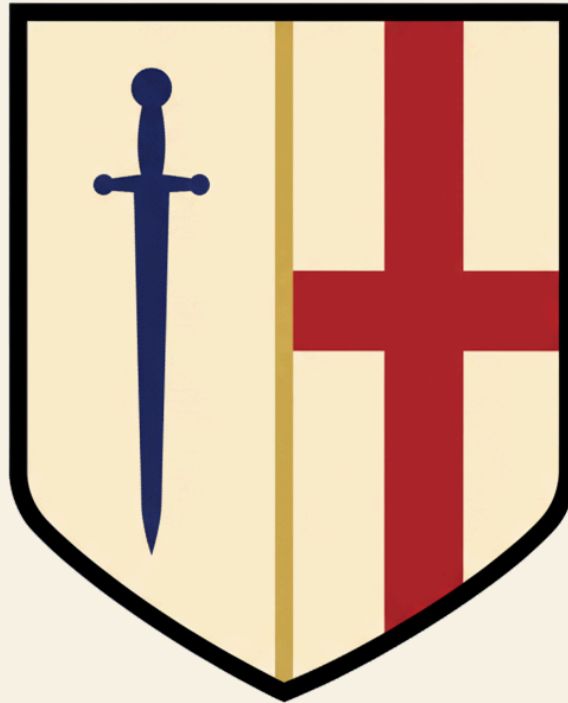
Men are formed by working alongside more experienced men.

HOW A TABLE BEGINS

The bishop authorizes a Table and names its **Captain** and **Chaplain**.

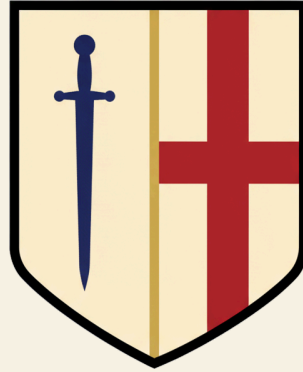
A Table starts with **the Watch** and **the Common Board**.

The Watch is its attention to the parish; the Common Board is where brothers trade skills and tasks.
